DECEMBER'S CHRISTMAS MEETING









150 YEARS AGO

January 1 - Stonewall Jackson wages his Romney Campaign in western Virginia.

January 11 - Secretary of War Simon Cameron resigns to become ambassador to Russia.

January 15 - Edwin M. Stanton replaces Cameron as Lincoln's secretary of war.

January 16 - Seven ironclad river gunboats are commissioned at St Louis for the Union river fleet.

January 19 The Battle of Mill Springs, Kentucky, is fought. Union forces gained the victory.

January 30 - The USS Monitor is launched at Greenport, Long Island, New York.





To care for Confederate wounded in the wake of the First Battle of Bull Run, diminutive Sally Tompkins of Richmond, Virginia, used her personal wealth and family connections to operate a private hospital. To allow her to maintain an official status, President Davis commissioned her a captain in the Army. "But I would not allow my name to be placed upon the pay roll," wrote Tompkins. By war's end she and her staff had treated 1,333 casualties.
